### May General Meeting Minutes

**Date:** May 19, 2016 at Bass Pro in Independence, Mo.

**Open:** **Bob Williams**, President, opened the meeting at 7pm welcoming and invited **Cathy Misko**, Youth Scholarship Chairperson to explain about the Silent Auction we were having tonight.
